

We all had quite a year. It was hard and it was intense. Family Promise of Lawrence was uniquely positioned with our continuum of services and programs to increase service to our community during the pandemic. In 2020, we served twice the number of families we had served in the past 3 years combined. We sharpened our focus on housing and moved resources to cover our Prevention and Stabilization Programs. We kept the doors of shelter open by converting some of our Temporary Housing units to Shelter in Place units, and we offered 4 different program offerings to those who found themselves in a situation of homelessness.

You stepped up in unique and inspiring ways during this difficult pandemic. Thank you for your generous financial support, volunteer service, and compassionate hospitality. You provided and prepared 16,000 meals, and you checked in with program families. You served as C2C partners and you coordinated rental and utility supports.
