Dear Partners,


You are indeed partners in this endeavor of supporting families, our neighbors, who find themselves in a housing crisis. We are all a needed part of the solution of family homelessness and instability.

# Eviction Prevention

Early intervention through case management support and financial assistance so families can remain housed

In 2025, **152** families, **322** children were served. **98%** of them avoided eviction

# Diversion from Shelter

Assists families who are able to use their own safe supports to divert/avoid entering shelter

In 2025 we served 102 families, 195 children in this program. 95% of them did not enter shelter.



# Shelter

Temporary shelter program for families that have no other safe alternatives

**28 families, 60 children were served in shelter services in 2025.**

Average Shelter Stay= 58 Days

Total shelter nights = 8,986

In 2025, our partners at Good Energy Solutions installed solar panels helping us offset the cost of monthly electricity bills.

# Stabilization

Long term case management support to assist families across the continuum of FPL programming

In 2025, 53 families, 108 children were served, 93% of them were stably housed at exit.

# Housing

We added a **NEW** program in 2025! We now offer affordable housing units managed/owned by Family Promise of Lawrence and leased to eligible families for 1 year or more.

Thanks to several community partners, our new housing program includes 3 single family houses that eligible families can lease for 1 year or more.



Thanks to our partner 9<sup>th</sup> Street Missionary Baptist Church, this 6-plex apartment building will be available in 2026, for 6 new families in our Housing program.

# Community Connections & Volunteers



Housing stability is strengthened through strong community connections. In addition to providing direct financial assistance and case management, we build coordinated partnerships with local service providers, schools, landlords, workforce programs, and healthcare organizations to ensure families can access the full range of support they need.

- ★ 85+ supporting business, organizations and civic groups
- ★ Over 500 volunteers
- ★ Total volunteer hours = 8,335.5
- ★ Number of meals served = 3,835



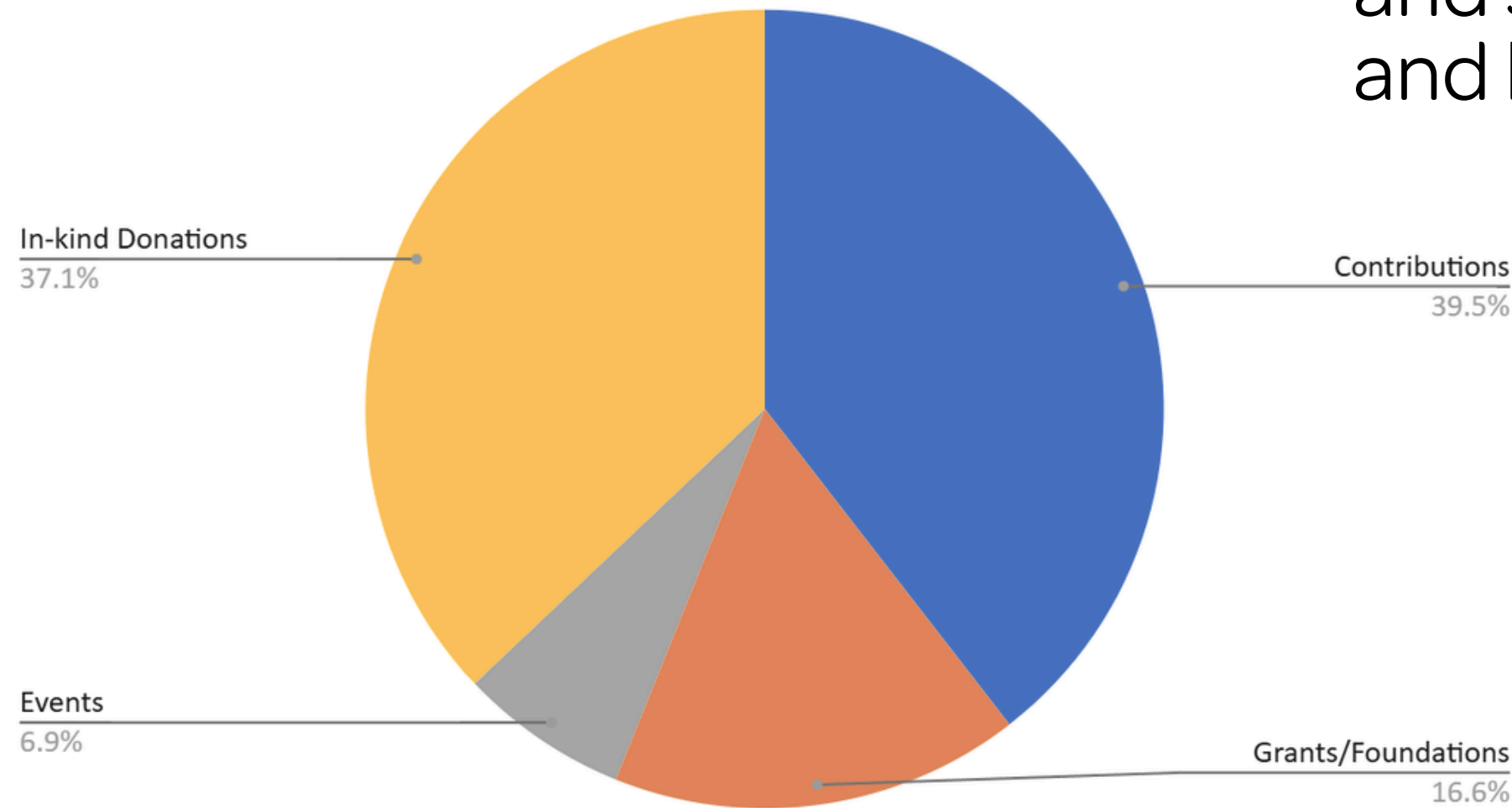

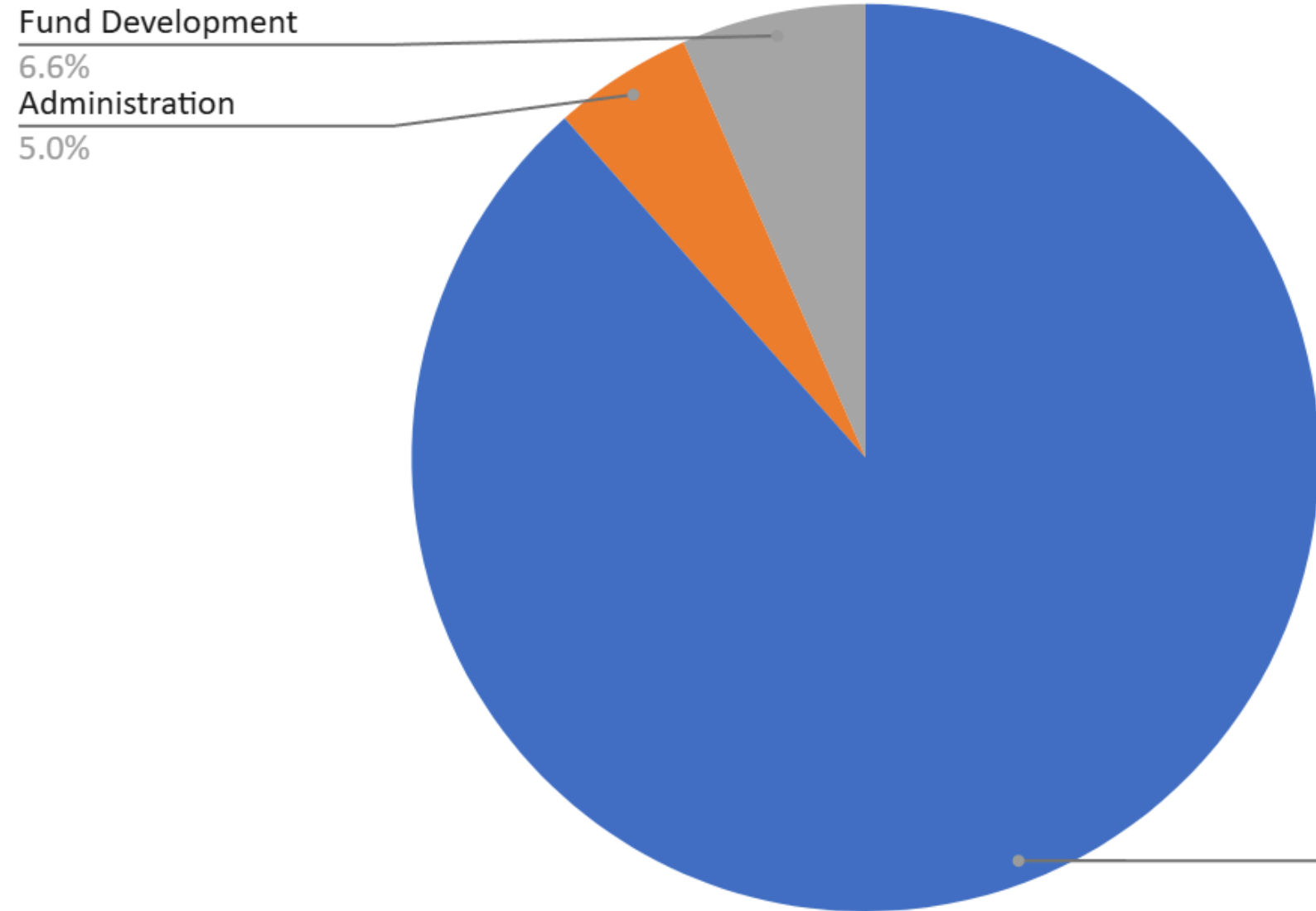
